**Dr David Martin** is a former Headmaster of a state school in the United Kingdom. He taught leadership courses at the University of Amsterdam and lectured at Oxford University. Dr Martin has been an International Consultant for Secondary School Modernization in Trinidad and Tobago and in Guyana. He has, also, worked for the Inter-American Development Bank, and has served as Co-Director of Developing Schools and Services for Democracy in Europe and in Oxford. In addition, he has served as a Research Fellow in Comparative Education and Development programmes at the University of Reading.

Dr Kern Alexander is an Excellence Professor in the College of Education at University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, where he teaches education finance and law. He is Editor of the Journal of Education Finance, published by the University of Illinois Press and Project MUSE, Johns Hopkins University Press. Prior to coming to the University of Illinois, he served as President of Western Kentucky University, Bowling Green, and of Murray State University, where he retains the title of President Emeritus. Dr Alexander is the author or co-author of thirty books, including *American Public School Law*, 8th Edition, Wadsworth-Cengage Learning, 2012, *The Law of Schools, Students and Teachers*, 6th Edition, West Publishing Company, 2018, and *Financing Public Schools: Theory, Policy, and Practice*, Routledge, 2015.

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
