He was previously Fellow and Chaplain of Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge. His main interests are in the area of contemporary questions of faith and doctrine, and currently is working on religious intuition, and also on how contemporary nano-science presents a way of looking at reality which might be helpful to theological reflection.

He is Publisher at Large for the Circle Books imprint of Collective Ink Books Ltd., a publishing house which specialises in religion & mind, body, and spirit. His memoir Church Going Gone – a biography of religion, doubt and faith is available on Amazon or at Blackwells. His 2022 book title Religion and Generation Z – why 70% of 18-24-year-olds say they have no religion speaks for itself. His bestselling book, Christian Atheist (2011), explores the phenomenon of those who find Christianity compelling, but struggle with its metaphysical beliefs.
