Dr David Martin is a former Headmaster of a state school in the United Kingdom. He taught leadership courses at the University of Amsterdam and lectured at Oxford University. Dr Martin has been an International Consultant for Secondary School Modernization in Trinidad and Tobago and in Guyana. He has, also, worked for the Inter-American Development Bank, and has served as Co-Director of Developing Schools and Services for Democracy in Europe and in Oxford. In addition, he has served as a Research Fellow in Comparative Education and Development programmes at the University of Reading.

Dr Kern Alexander is an Excellence Professor in the College of Education at University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, where he teaches school finance and higher education finance. He is Editor of the Journal of Education Finance, published by the University of Illinois Press. Prior to coming to the University of Illinois, he served as President of Western Kentucky University, Bowling Green, and of Murray State University, where he retains the title of President Emeritus. Dr Alexander isthe author or co-author of thirty books, including *American Public School Law*, 8th Edition, Wadsworth-Cengage Learning, 2012, *The Law of Schools, Students and Teachers*, 4th Edition, West Publishing Company, 2009, and *Financing Public Schools: Theory, Policy, and Practice*, Routledge, 2014.

Dr M David Alexander is a Professor of Education specializing in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies. To date he has authored or coauthored more than 65 articles, books, and book chapters. He has also contributed greatly to the field by presenting at many national and international conferences. In addition to being actively involved in research, he also engages in extensive consulting activities for local, state, and national school systems. He is a member of the British Educational Leadership, Management and Administration Society, Royal Society for the Arts, Australian-New Zealand Education Law Association, and South African Education Law Association. He has also held leadership positions in the National Council for Professor of Educational Administration, the Education Law Association, to name just a few.
