Brian Mountford MBE was Vicar of the University Church, Oxford, from 1986-2016 and is a Supernumerary Fellow St. Hilda's College, Oxford. He is also Canon Emeritus of Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford. He was previously Fellow and Chaplain of Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge. His memoir Church Going Gone – a biography of religion, doubt and faith is now available on Amazon or at Blackwells. This year will also see the publication of Religion and Generation Z - why 70% of 18-24-year-olds say they have no religion, which he edited and contributed to.
