Dr David Martin is a former Headmaster of a state school in the United Kingdom. He has taught leadership courses at the University of Amsterdam and lectured at Oxford University. Dr Martin has been an International Consultant for Secondary School Modernization in Trinidad and Tobago and in Guyana. He has also worked for the Inter-American Development Bank, and has served as Co-Director of Developing Schools and Services for Democracy in Europe and in Oxford. In addition, he has served as a Research Fellow in Comparative Education and Development programmes at the University of Reading.

William Martin BA Plymouth College, UK *summa cum laude* specialising in advanced studies in philosophy, sport sciences and photography. He is now studying for a specialist journalism honours degree in sports journalism. He has been contracted to Derbyshire County first class cricket club to set up and operate live filming, streaming and commentary in 2021. Dr Alexander is the author or co-author of thirty books, including *American Public School Law*, 9th Edition, West Academic Publishing, 2019; The Law of Schools, Students and Teachers, 6th Edition, West Academic Publishing, 2018; and Financing Public Schools: Theory, Policy, and Practice, Routledge, 2015.

Dr. Rachel Fernflores is an Associate Professor at California Polytechnic State University. In her work she focuses on the future of feminism and intersections between theories of interpretation and issues regarding finding one's voice in the written word.
